Dear Employer,

Colorado citizens serve as jurors in courtrooms across the state to ensure the integrity of our justice system. Recognizing the importance of jury service, the state legislature has enacted statutes governing the rights and obligations of both employers and employees when an employee has jury duty.


Briefly summarized, these statutes require employers to pay the employee-juror regular wages, up to \$50 per day, for the first three days of the employee's jury service if the juror was scheduled to work during those first three days. In addition, employers cannot threaten, coerce, or discharge an employee for reporting for jury duty as summoned.
