Tips for filing out your forms:



- Remember to fill out all sections of the form, if it does not apply indicate that by using N/A in that section
- Use the most current version of the form
- Make sure to sign each document
- If you are filing into an existing case include the case number
- If you are handwriting your documents make sure they are legible, these become part of the Courts official record
- Provide the Court with the required forms, this includes the original Will if there is one.
