ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER 2000-02 amended

Appointment of Members to Juvenile Planning Board

WHEREAS, on July 31, 1997, pursuant to Administrative Order #97-08, Robert A. Brown, then Chief Judge of the Seventh Judicial District of Colorado, ordered the creation of a Juvenile Planning Board with the approval of the boards of county commissioners for the six counties which comprise the Seventh Judicial District;

AND WHEREAS, the undersigned has been advised that it is now necessary to appoint new members and reaffirm others to the board due to attrition and expiring appointments. The City of Montrose has named Noel Hagan as the replacement for Greg Clifton, whose term ends on June 30, 2000. Donna Ferganchick, Delta County Commissioner, is vacating her position and Raynor Eymann has expressed a willingness to serve in her place. Mabel Risch and John DeVore have expressed a willingness to continue as board members.

NOW THEREFORE, the undersigned hereby appoints the following persons to their respective terms as members of the Juvenile Planning Board for the Seventh Judicial District of Colorado, and directs that said persons shall serve for the period of the terms indicated, and thereafter until their successors are duly appointed:


