IV. Proposed drafts of Colorado Appellate Rules

The following issues and revisions were discussed:

• C.A.R. 28

- Judge Freyre brought this to the Committee following feedback received from an attorney. The attorney suggested changing Rule 28 so that people are required to articulate the standard of reversal. The Committee discussed that this may be a training issue and decided to take no action.
- Gender Neutral Rules
 - Judge Gomez reported that there is an effort underway to ensure that Colorado Supreme Court's rules are gender neutral. The Chairs of all the rules committees are working together to develop a policy to present to the Court. This project is in the early stages, so this is simply an informational report.
- C.A.R. 4.1
 - This proposal came from the Court. The Committee unanimously approved the proposed changes.
- C.A.R. 21 and Companion Rules 29, 32, and 40
 - Melissa Meirink spoke on the proposed changes to Rule 21, which were aimed at modernization and clarity. The Committee unanimously approved all the proposed changes.
 - Rules 29, 32, and 40 required updates in response to the proposed changes to Rule 21. The Committee unanimously approved the proposals.
