What's Recovery Court?



- Intervention approach for people with substance use disorder involved in Justice System.
- 3-year probation sentence supervised by Recovery Court.
- Wrap Around Services:
 - Individualized Treatment
 - Housing
 - Employment and/or Education
 - Family
 - Overall Stability Factors
- Opportunity of change where people work to better their health and wellness, live the life they want, and move toward reaching their full potential.
- Stop the cycle and address underlined issues.





Areas identified to help people get into and stay in recovery long term.

- Follow terms and conditions of Probation
- 2. Show on time for court and other appointments
- 3. Take your drug tests
- 4. You cannot use alcohol, illegal drugs, or marijuana
- 5. Do not misuse substances
- Be responsible for what you put in your body, and what you are around physically
- 7. Avoid diluting drug test, and don't manipulate drug test





- 8. Tell a team member if you want to use or have used
- 9. Medication(s)
- 10. Medication Assisted Treatment (M.A.T.)
- 11. Employment and Education
- 12. Permission and Communication to Travel
- 13. Community Service/Useful Public Service (UPS) Hours
- 14. Payment of Services, Living Expenses, Restitution, and Court Cost

INCENTIVES

- Courtroom recognition
- Certificates of achievement
- Gift cards
- Credit for UPS
- Decreased court appearances
- Phase advancement
- Voucher assistance
- Travel permit
- Early termination from probation
- WebEx court appearance
- Reduction in fines and cost
- Bus passes and other transportation assistance

THERAPEUTIC ADJUSTMENTS


- Daily sober support meetings
- Relapse autopsy
- Increased drug testing
- Individual treatment sessions
- Participation in additional evaluations
- Peer coaching
- Therapeutic assignment
- Prosocial activities
- Increased therapeutic contact
- Specialized support groups (H.E.A.T., MRT, COGS Skills, Neurofeedback)

SANCTIONS

- Increased court appearances
- Daily reporting to probation
- Curfew imposed
- Additional UPS
- Presentations
- Delays in phase
- Homework
- Additional monitoring
- Issuance of Warrant or sentence to jail
- Motion to Revoke Probation
- Termination from the program


Recovery Court Phase Movement
