CHIEF JUDGE ORDER 05-01 PRIVATE PROBATION POLICY 17TH JUDICIAL DISTRICT

POLICY: PER CHIEF JUSTICE DIRECTIVE (CJD 04-03 part III), MINIMUM LEVEL SUPERVISION CASES ARE ELIGIBLE FOR REFERRAL TO PRIVATE PROBATION AGENCIES.

PROCEDURE:

SUPERVISION CASES: PER JUDGE BOCKMAN ALL CASE CONSIDERED FOR PROBATION WILL BE SENT TO THE STATE PROBATION DEPARTMENT. SHOULD THE COURT BELIEVE PRIVATE PROBATION IS APPROPRIATE, THE COURT CAN INDICATE ON THE SENTENCING INSTRUCTIONS ON EITHER OR BOTH THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS AND MINUTE ORDER INSTRUCTIONS. COMPUTER CODING WILL ONLY REQUIRE THE CLERKS OFFICE TO ENTER (PROB) CODE. AND ONCE THE CASE IS RECEIVED BY THE PROBATION OFFICE, PROBATION WILL ASSESS AND DETERMINE ASSIGNMENT.

PRE- SENTENCE REPORTS:

TO REMAIN CONSISTENT WITH THE CHIEF JUSTICE DIRECTIVE REQUIRNG ONLY MINIMAL LEVEL CASES BEING REFERRED TO PRIVATE, ALL FELONY PRE-SENTENCE REPORTS SHOULD BE REFERRED TO STATE PROBATION. MISDEMEANOR REPORTS AT THE COURTS DISCRETION CAN BE REFERRED TO THE PRIVATE CONTRACTOR. WE HAVE CONTRACTED WITH BOTH INTERVENTION AND ROCKY MOUNTAIN OFFENDER MANAGEMENT SYSTEMS; PER CONTRACT ODD NUMBERED CASES GO TO INTERVENTION AND EVEN NUMBERED CASES TO RMOMS.

ADDS (DUI/DAWI)

NO CHANGE IN POLICY. CASES WILL BE REFERRED THE SAME AS PREVIOUSLY. NO CHANGE IN CODING OR PROCESSING. PRIVATE PROBATION CAN STILL BE UTILIZED BASED ON POLICY AND WITH ODD CASE NUMBER CASES GOING TO INTERVENTION AND EVEN NUMBERED CASE NUMBERS BEING SENT TO ROCKY MOUNTAIN OFFENDER MANAGEMENT SYSTEMS.

ORDER OF THE CHIEF JUDGE

PROBATION PRIORITIES - COUNTY COURT

Investigation services shall be governed by the priorities established by Chief Justice Directive 02-02 and the 17th Judicial District. The 17th Judicial District may order Probation to complete Pre-Sentence Investigation Reports on the following County Court cases:

- 1. Domestic violence misdemeanors (These shall be limited to cases where the DVSI is 11 and above and does not include petty offenses)
- 2. Sexual offenses (Any)
- 3. Child abuse
- 4. Assault (no petty offenses)

The court shall not order a pre-sentence investigation to be completed by the 17th Probation in the following cases:

- 1. Non-person misdemeanor crimes
- 2. Misdemeanor drug offenses
- 3. Any petty offense- these are priority III
- 4. Pre-plea
- 5. DUI/DUR (An Alcohol Evaluation is always completed on DUI/DUR cases)
- 6. DUR conviction only.

Cases may be referred to Intervention Inc. or to Rocky Mountain Offender Management Systems (RMOMS), for pre-sentence investigation reports that do not fall into the categories of Pre-Sentence Investigations that will be completed by the 17th Judicial Probation Department.

The Brighton office will direct all defendants and juveniles to make payments at the Adams County Courthouse.

The Broomfield office will direct all defendants and juveniles to make payments at the Broomfield City and County Courthouse.
