ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER OF THE CHIEF JUDGE

Handling Juvenile Bonds.

To ensure that juveniles who have been charged with a crime and given a bond are able to post that bond in a timely manner and to best serve the community, the Chief Judge of the Seventeenth Judicial District gives authority to the agencies listed below to handle juvenile bonds as outlined:

Personal Recognizance (PR) Bonds

Adams County & Broomfield County District & County Court (Traffic, DUI only) offenses for Juveniles: Personal Recognizance (PR) Bonds for Juveniles can be posted at Adams Youth Services Center (AYSC) 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

Broomfield County District and County Court offenses (Traffic or Misdemeanor: petty offenses only): Personal Recognizance (PR) Bonds for Juveniles can be posted at the Broomfield Jail/Detention Center 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

Adams County and Broomfield County District and County Court (Traffic or Misdemeanor: petty offenses only) offenses: Personal Recognizance (PR) Bonds for Juveniles can be posted at The Link, Community Assessment & Resource Center serving the 17th Judicial District, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

Adams County and Broomfield County District and County Court (Traffic or Misdemeanor: petty offenses only) offenses: Personal Recognizance (PR) Bonds for Juveniles can be posted in Court or at the Clerk's window during business hours and only on the day that the youth is in court.

Cash Surety (CS) Bonds

Adams County & Broomfield County District & County Court (Traffic, DUI only) offenses for Juveniles: Cash Surety (CS) Bonds for Juveniles can be posted at Adams Youth Services Center (AYSC) 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Only a Cashier's Check, Money Order or Surety will be accepted.

Broomfield County District and County Court offenses (Traffic or Misdemeanor: petty offenses only): Cash Surety (CS) Bonds for Juveniles can be posted at Broomfield Jail/Detention Center 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

Adams County and Broomfield County District and County Court offenses (Traffic or Misdemeanor: petty offenses only): Cash Surety (CS) Bonds for Juveniles can be posted at The Link, Community Assessment & Resource Center serving the 17th Judicial District, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Only a Cashier's Check, Money Order or Surety will be accepted.

Adams County and Broomfield County District and County Court (Traffic or Misdemeanor: petty offenses only) offenses: Cash Surety (CS) Bonds for Juveniles can be posted in Court or at the Clerk's window during business hours and only on the day that the youth is in court.

Process to Release on Bond from Adams Youth Services Center (AYSC)

If a juvenile is detained at AYSC and a bond has been posted at The Link, Community Assessment & Resource Center serving the 17th Judicial District, AYSC, or at the Broomfield Jail/Detention Center, the juvenile's parent or guardian will bring the bond paperwork and payment to AYSC; AYSC staff will have the juvenile sign the bond; youth will be released to parent/guardian; AYSC staff mails the original signed bond and payment to the appropriate court.


