| ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER 2020-5 | |

When a defendant is sentenced to probation and ordered to pay supervision fees, it is the intent of the 8th Judicial District that continuing probation supervision fees be waived in any of the following circumstances:

- Defendant is deceased
- Defendant is re-sentenced to jail
- Defendant is re-sentenced to unsupervised probation
- Defendant is re-sentenced to Department of Corrections
- Defendant successfully completes Drug Court
- Defendant's probation supervision is transferred out of state
- Defendant completes court-ordered classes and probation is ordered to terminate supervision upon successful completion of classes
- Defendant's probation supervision is administered by Larimer County Community Corrections
- Defendant's probation supervision is transferred to a private probation service provider
- Defendant is ordered to probation in multiple cases and supervision fees need only be assessed in one case
- Defendant successfully completes either the AIIM program or Wellness Court


The Probation Department will notify the Clerk of Court Office and the Collections Office if any of the above circumstances apply.

1. The Court Clerk's office or designated Court Judicial Assistant will modify the existing sentence to reflect the waiver of probation supervision fees as requested by probation.
2. The Collections Office will follow normal procedure upon notification of waiver of probation supervision fees.

This Order supersedes and replaces Administrative Order Nos. 2003-2, 2003-3, 2003-4, 2003-5, 2004-1, 2004-2, 2004-3, 2009-3 and 2009-4, 2018-2, and any predecessors to those orders.

This policy is effective upon signing.
